This month's image is an old one, taken in Heinz Wildlife Preserve in Tinicum, PA. I am not sure what kind of tree it is, the seed look so familiar, but I can't find it in my books. There are a few things that interested me in this image.

The seeds are what first caught my attention. They are supported by a white and flat cover that flutters in the breeze, with the small black seed nestled in the center. They sometimes hang in clusters, which is very dramatic. This method of seed production is a bit unique. I really don't know what the flowers looked like.

But after the seed clusters drew me up close, I began to marvel at the leaf composition. I hope you can see what looks like the individual cells between the veins. I am sure the actual cells are much smaller than this, and I don't know what you would call these partitions, but the patterns and swirls that are highlighted by the back lighting of the sun are very dramatic.

I really enjoy getting up close and seeing the fine detail of The Creator's Fingerprints.
